

# Use of Pupil Premium at Garden Fields

In 2011-12 the Government launched its Pupil Premium funding. This money is sent to schools based on the numbers of pupils in the school who are eligible for Free School Meals (FSM), Children Looked After (CLA) and armed forces children. From 2012-13 this was expanded to include all children who have been eligible for FSM within the last 6 years.

This money is allocated to initiatives to ensure pupils reach their full potential, both academically and socially.

- ***Plan for Pupil Premium for 2018/19***

**In 2018-19 we are expecting to receive £52800 of Pupil Premium Funding however this may change over the year as pupils in reception register or we admit pupils who have pupil premium funding. Currently 43 children (end of September 2018)**

Intended spend	Costs	Objectives
Pastoral Support, Mentoring and Mediation	£13,700	To support pupils' self-esteem, attitudes to learning, sense of well-being and enjoyment of school.
Nurture Groups in all year groups	£11,452	Understanding and developing good learning skills, life skills and attitudes and developing emotional resilience and empathy for others.
Funding places on school trips and extra-curricular club places	£4,000	To enhance the curriculum, ensure the children are able to participate and to give children the opportunity to experience new and challenging activities.
Extra teacher working with group in maths after Spring half term	£4000	To improve the maths skills across the whole school by ensuring small size groups and inclusive opportunities.
Access to Specialist Support Staff	£16,648	To provide specialist literacy support for specific learning difficulties such as dyslexia as well as improving the confidence of pupils with reading, spelling and writing.
Read, Write, Inc. and Fresh Start	£14,500	To improve the literacy skills across the whole school by ensuring small size groups and inclusive opportunities.

- ***Review of 2017/18***

***In 2017-18 the school received £54,700 in Pupil Premium funding.***

**We aim to raise the attainment and achievement of Pupil Premium pupils to ensure that they reach age related expectations through the following support:**

- Provision of additional staffing to raise levels in Reading, Writing and Mathematics.
- Provision of emotional and social support for both pupils and families to improve and ensure good attendance, behaviour in order to develop positive attitudes to learning.
- Enhance experiences and increase access to activities that both support and engage pupils in achieving age related standards.

This money was used to help provide for the following initiatives:-

- **Year 6 Attainment and Progress 2018 in KS2 SATs:**

*All 3 children in receipt of the pupil premium achieved the expected standard in Reading, Writing and Maths. In Reading, Writing and Maths their progress measures were +2.57, -0.47 and +1.75*
